## LRA News

### Fairview Homes Developments on Borders Lane: Lucton's Field and the College Middle Site

LRA Cllr Chris Pond, David Linnell and Michael Benbow attended the online appeal hearing against the District Council's failure to make a decision on Fairview Homes proposals for developments on Lucton's Field (opposite the College) and on the

Middle Site. LRA committee member Michael Benbow spoke on behalf of a group of 217 residents.



The Council argued that Fairview Homes were trying to put too many dwellings on the site, and that the design was unsatisfactory. Much of the discussion was on technical planning points. Chris gave cogent arguments against any development on Lucton's Field, and David spoke on what we see as a fundamental legal flaw in the Council's approach which means that building shouldn't be allowed on either of the two sites until a complete and detailed Air Pollution Mitigation Strategy is put in place (see LRA's comments on the next item). Michael stressed the excessive density of the proposed development.

We now await the Planning Inspector's decision, which may not appear for many weeks.

In our last news email we described the reason for the Fairview Homes planning hearing as the District Council turning down the proposals. In fact the reason was that the District Council failed to take any decisions on Fairview Homes' proposals so they asked for the decisions to be made by a Planning Inspector. Our apologies for any misunderstanding.

### **Planning Applications delayed by EFSAC issues**

At the District Council's Development Management Committee meeting on April 26th, LRA Cllrs secured a delay in the release of planning permissions on the two sites (51 High Rd and 113 Church Hill) in Loughton very near the Forest. These sites will be reassessed by the officers and a further report made to the committee.

LRA Cllrs were supported by Green Cllr Simon Heap, who pointed out that because of the slow activation of catalytic convertors, vehicles starting from new developments very near the Forest would have much more deleterious an effect than those just passing through.

*LRA comment: LRA considers that the Council's Interim Air Pollution Mitigation Strategy completely fails to meet the requirements of the relevant legislation. The developments being considered are small, the largest one in Loughton being 10 units, but the principle is important, as the law refers to all developments, singly or with others, and implementing these approvals would inevitably lead to further damage to the Epping Forest Special Area of Conservation.*

### Pick up a testing kit from Loughton Library, Traps Hill

You can now pick up Covid testing kits at Loughton Library. The LFT\* tests are quick and easy to do, and help is available on a dedicated helpline (03337 726 144). Or you can [book a PCR\\* test at one of the many mobile testing units](#) operating across Essex.



Targeted groups, including the households and bubbles of school-aged children and

businesses with more than 10 employees should continue to use the specific testing channels already in place for them. If you have Covid symptoms, please [book a PCR Covid-19 test](#) as normal.

### **Government's Test and Trace payment scheme**

You can apply to the District Council for £500 if you're required to self-isolate for up to 14 days, cannot work from home and are on a low income or in receipt of qualifying benefits and have household savings less than £16,000, or if you're a parent or guardian of an infant or child required to stay at home upon the instruction of a childcare provider or school. So far, the District Council has processed around 900 applications and has paid out over £160,000.

### **Making our high streets safer**

The District Council has finally received draft town centre appraisals from their consultant covering The Broadway and the High Road. These reports will be presented to the Cabinet this month with additional information gathered after the return to trading on April 12th.

*LRA comment: the Council seems to have been extremely dilatory – measures for Epping High Road (a smaller and less frequented shopping area than the High Road) have been in place for months. We will continue to press for some action in Loughton.*

### **Grants to help businesses be Covid safe**

Funding is available to help small and medium size businesses trade safely as the move out of lockdown begins. The Essex Business Adaptation Funding (EBAF) is providing grants of either £500, £1,000 or £1,500 to support local businesses in carrying out adjustments to their premises, enabling them to operate in a COVID-secure way. More than 100 local businesses have accessed around £140,000, but more funding is still available and applications can be made up to July 1st.

The money could be used to pay for screens or barriers to protect customers and staff, for outdoor seating or shelters to trade outdoors. It can even be spent on for digital technology to establish an online presence. However it cannot be used to pay for costs such as rent, wages or PPE. The grant is non-repayable and applications are normally turned around within a week.

### **District Council activity on Covid**

The Council has served three prohibition notices relating to Covid breaches. Two car washes also received Fixed Penalty Notices of £1,000 (these were paid within 14 days and were discounted to £500).

## Planning and Licensing

[Read more on our website](#) about Planning and Licensing, the role of the LRA Plans Group (LRAPG), how to get more information and how to comment to the Town Council and the District Council.

The District Council takes the decisions on planning applications. The application will be decided upon by a Council Officer or by Cllrs in a District Council Planning Committee, and residents' comments on the proposals will be taken into account but not necessarily agreed with. This is a quasi-legal process, and decisions have to be taken **on planning grounds only**, based on the national planning legislation and the District Local Plan, whatever the views and feelings of the individual Cllrs involved.

*If you wish to comment, don't delay. The process is time critical with several stages along the way. If you wish to make comments please try to submit them before the deadline set by the Council. Although submissions can be made and have to be considered up to the time a decision is made, once the statutory deadline has passed, the application might be determined before your comments are received.*

The process for alcohol licensing applications is similar to the process for planning applications, except that objections must relate to one or more of [the four Licensing Objectives](#) (page 4, section 1.7) and any comments received after the end of the formal consultation period won't be taken into account by the District Council.

### Pizza Hut, 21 The Broadway

Pizza Hut have applied for a new Premises Licence to provide food till 1am.

LRAPG has objected to this application as there are flats above the shops on The Broadway, and opening until 1am would mean disturbance for residents from customers and delivery vehicles above the shop and in the side area.

### 46 Pyrles Lane (was Martins)

An application has been made to change this shop into an Indian takeaway, with a roof mounted filtered extraction unit at the back.

LRAPG has objected to this application as the proposed extractor system will discharge below the flats and when the wind is blowing in the wrong direction the fumes will go into open windows. The extractor system will also affect the prospects of redeveloping the garages,

Application [EPF/0517/21](#). The formal consultation period has ended.

### **Green's Steakhouse & Grill, 200 High Road**

Green's have applied for a pavement licence for five tables, 20 chairs, and three umbrellas for the consumption of food and/or drink by customers, Monday to Sunday 11:45am to 11pm.

LRAPG has objected to this application as it will obstruct the footpath and impact on Covid safety social distancing.

### **Woodstock, 229 High Road**

Woodstock have applied for a pavement licence for seven tables and 14 chairs for the consumption of food and/or drink by customers, Monday to Sunday 7am to 8pm.

LRAPG has objected to this application as it will obstruct the footpath and impact on Covid safety social distancing.

## ***Roads, Parking and Travel***

### **District Council online parking information**

Residents and visitors to the District are telling the Council they would like to see more information on where they can park, as well as the cost of a parking permit and the location of electronic vehicle charging points.



The Council's [website](#) currently contains information on its pay and display car parks and each of the locations provides a link to the MIPermit website which includes a map. Information on parking permits is also available on the website. The Council are looking at how to improve the website's search facility so it covers third party sites to ensure information is accessible and easy to find.

### **Public Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging**

The District Council is working with two EV charging providers to deliver public 'rapid' 50kW chargers (80% charge in 30 mins) in various Council short stay car parks. Both operators work on a site rental/profit share basis and provide ongoing maintenance and upgrades over the contracted period (10+ years). Both offer very good customer service according to Zapmap reviews and usage data, and allow simple contactless card payment options instead of restrictive membership cards and apps.

According to [Zapmap](#), there are only three 'rapid' charging sites in the whole of the District, which is likely to be restricting EV purchasers locally to those with off street parking. Despite this, Epping Forest has the second highest number of EVs and plug-in hybrids on the roads in Essex.

Exploratory work is underway to add public 'fast' (overnight) public EV charging options for residential areas. One option is the use of lamp posts by networks such as char.gy and Ubitricity. As most lamp posts are owned by the County Council, the District Council is initially exploring use of District Council owned lamp posts, some of which meet the requirement of being located kerbside and in relatively unrestricted locations (that is, not in resident-only car parks).

### **Highways schemes**

A few, mostly small, schemes have been advertised by the North Essex Parking Partnership (NEPP). These have come from resident pressure or because NEPP's wardens (Civil Enforcement Officers) noticed issues and are mostly in St John's and St Mary's wards.

They include:

- a loading bay outside 73 Forest Road
- double red lines round sharp bends and intersections on the Borders Lane Redrow Estate, to stop vehicles obstructing to dustcarts, etc.
- a Controlled Parking Zone for Shelley Grove Monday to Friday, 10am to 2pm, excluding Bank & Public Holidays
- double red lines for safety in Pyrles Lane and Fairmeads near the Forest Surgery
- double yellow lines near the Foresters' Arms at the junction of Stony Path and Baldwins Hill (this scheme dates from 2003 but the District Council failed to make the order legal at the time).

### Highway Rangers

The [District Council Rangers](#) continue to work on issues reported by residents, Cllrs and the County Council. For example, they have cut back hedges encroaching from Council land onto paths and have re-set many pavement bollards that have been struck by vehicles, (some of which have been broken for years). A contractor has been tasked with removing old defective coin-operated bike loops in the High Road and installing new ones.

### Roadworks in March

In Epping Forest District, County Highways repaired 65 potholes, fixed 45 pavement defects, cleared 362 drains and fixed 239 streetlights.



### TfL travel information

TfL say that their transport network has never been cleaner. Since September, Imperial College London has run monthly tests for coronavirus on the transport network and found no trace. They ask travellers to use alternative transport where possible, or to travel at the quieter times. The [TfL Go app](#) can help you plan your journey and shows the quieter times to travel.



You must continue to wear a face covering over your nose and mouth at all times when on the transport network, unless exempt. There are fines of up to £6,400 for anyone who does not comply. Please also wash or sanitise your hands before and after travel.

Some Tube and DLR stations are temporarily not accepting cash at ticket machines and so only accept card payments.

### Problems in Clifton Road late last year

Following numerous complaints about continuing anti-social behaviour in the Clifton Road area, the Community Policing Team worked closely with the District Council to sort out the problem. Reports indicated that the car park was being used as a gathering location for people and vehicles, leading to disorder and noise nuisance. Increased patrols in late December and into the New Year identified a number of people and vehicles involved. Meanwhile the Council secured funding and has installed gates to the car park. Residents have thanked local police officers for their efforts.

### Loughton man arrested in Buckhurst Hill

In mid April, officers from the Epping Forest Police Community Safety Team arrested a 20 year old male from Loughton after a short pursuit, on suspicion of possession with intent to supply a controlled drug and driving without insurance. He was also later further arrested on suspicion of taking a vehicle without the owner's consent (the vehicle was recovered at the scene). Enquiries continue.

### District Council CCTV

The Council has actively worked with the Police to identify suspects involved in various incidents, including a window being broken at the HSBC Bank on the High Road, 30+ youths engaging in a fight in The Broadway involving a weapon (a machete), and a driver who tried to drive a vehicle so as to hit pedestrians in The Broadway. Rapid deployment cameras have been used in Loughton to observe compliance with the COVID regulations.

## Council News

### Refurbishment of the District Council offices, Epping

The planned refurbishment is in its final stages. The Council is holding meetings with possible outside users of the building and has started on a phased return to occupying the building.



They say the refurbishment continues to be within the agreed budget. When residents can visit the new welcome lounge there will be receptionists/floor walkers smartly dressed in a uniform of a white shirt and navy bottoms plus a 'Here to Help' lanyard so that they are easily recognisable. New visitor management kiosks will enable customers to self-check in and to alert officers to their arrival (this is for customers with pre booked appointments; those without appointments will be assisted by the welcome team).

### **District Council housebuilding cost over-runs**

At a recent District Council meeting on the progress of the Council's council house projects it was pointed out that, since the Council had recommenced building council houses, almost every scheme had come out over budget, which strongly suggested that the budgets weren't being set properly.

Officers have been asked to prepare a report of all schemes to date, the costs predicted for each scheme and how much the schemes actually cost. Going forward, the Council has appointed a new Service Manager for Housing Development and is introducing a new budgeting process which should place much greater emphasis on correct forward budgeting.

### **Laptops for schools scheme re-opened for donations**

### **Epping Forest Youth Council (EFYC)**

EFYC is a high-profile national award-winning Youth Council, comprising 25 young people, representing 9 Epping Forest secondary schools, with one independent member. Last year they provided an opportunity for young people to share their experiences during the Covid pandemic and express their concerns about their

health and wellbeing, their future regarding their education, and their mental health. This led on to a 10-week virtual programme for schools giving young people what they need to build their emotional resilience, with a [website](#) incorporating bespoke resources directly relating to Covid 19 and its impact on young people, and [a promotional film](#).

### Essex Record Office – a hidden jewel

Tucked away in Chelmsford, the [Essex Record Office](#) holds a vast range of information:

- Public Records
- Local government records
- Church of England and nonconformist church records
- Manorial records
- Deposited records
- Pictorial collections
- Sound and video recordings
- Local studies library materials
- County Council art collection.

Surprisingly, through their conferences, operations and grants in 19/20 they generated an income of over £600,000, which covered just over half of their operating costs. Over the last year, Covid-19 has seen their online research and search workload increase dramatically, although many of their core services, events and conferences have been badly affected by Covid closures. ## Local News

### Travellers on Jessel Green

Residents were concerned when, in mid April, 20-plus traveller caravans arrived on Jessel Green. The District Council took prompt action and the travellers moved on, leaving the Council to mount a clean-up operation to remove fly-tipped waste and litter.

### Tree Prosecution

Last month a Brooklyn Avenue resident pleaded guilty to causing or permitting the lopping of an ash tree with a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) on the border of his property without authorisation from the District Council. As he pleaded guilty at the first available time, he was fined £512 (instead of £768), and was ordered to pay a contribution towards the Council's prosecution costs of £1,550 and a victim surcharge of £51.

*LRA comment: a tree may be protected because it's in a Conservation Area or because there's a Tree Protection Order on it ([more](#)). It's a criminal offence to fell or lop protected trees without permission (owners should apply to the District Council, who will normally approve lopping where there's a good reason – sometimes owners may need to get an expert opinion to support their case, particularly where they want to fell a tree). If you suspect that illegal work is underway, please let the District Council know asap (01992 564000).*

### **Epping Forest Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB)**

The County Council have terminated the CAB's lease at Loughton Library (Traps Hill) as part of the Council's redevelopment plans for the building, and there is no new lease available at present. There are no plans to make room for the CAB in the redeveloped Loughton Library building or in Waltham Abbey Town Hall (which LRA are opposing).

## **Health and Wellbeing**

### **Expert Child Health advice at your fingertips**

It is normal to feel anxious when your child is ill. Sometimes their illness is obvious – they may have visible symptoms such as a runny nose. At other times it isn't as easy to identify the problem even though you know your child best and can spot if something is wrong. Most illnesses such as sore throats and ear ache get better by themselves but it's important that parents know what to do if their child is unwell and how to recognise the signs.

### **Visiting Epping Forest**

Some facilities have re-opened:

### **Car parks**

All car parks remain open other than temporary closures for already scheduled works. Car parks are likely to be crowded. If you can't park safely please try a different car park or return later. Always wait until you can leave or return to your car with the appropriate social distance between yourself and other car park users. From May 10, charges are being introduced in some car parks - the only one in Loughton affected is at Connaught Water.

### **Toilets**

Public toilets at High Beach and Wanstead Park are open and facilities at the Visitor Centre at Chingford are open in line with usual opening times.

### **Café Tenants**


### Cycling

### District Council Countrycare's Spring Wildlife Walk

The good news is that as many as 25 butterfly species have been found on the Reserve. Unfortunately, Oak Processionary moth nests have also appeared; as chemicals might harm the butterflies, the moth nests will be removed manually by contractors.



Cattle are now back on the reserve. The cows will be grazing the meadows as they have been for centuries past, part of the routine management to look after the wildflower meadows. All gates into the fields have signs on them and posters have been put up on the Essex Wildlife Trust notice boards. Find out more about the reserve [here](#).
